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Purpose

Create a series of recommendations and action steps for consideration in the development of an operational plan to address homelessness in the Tri-Cities region.




Methodology

- Reviewed recent documents (e.g., D.U. Studies, PESTLE Study, Colorado State Homelessness Playbook) outlining current conditions and vision for addressing homelessness at a state and local level.
- Conducted 53 Oral Stakeholder Interviews.
- Stakeholders received three open-ended questions as prompts to guide the interviews:
 - What is working?
 - What can be improved?
 - What priorities would you like to see the Action Plan address?
- Compared findings with those identified in the two Center for Housing and Homelessness Reports
 (Denver University), the PESTEL Analysis, and the MDHI presentation at the joint Council meeting held
 on January 28, 2021.



Stakeholder Composition





General Stakeholder Themes

•Hopes:

Wide range of basic homeless services throughout the region with dedicated staff and volunteers.

•Fears:

New programs may be expensive and attract additional people in need from the region, overwhelming local services.

•Desires:

Streamline access to homeless services and increase data collection to have a better understanding of need in near-real time.



Cumulative Findings

- Strengthened regional coordination between cities and County
- Streamline access to homeless services
- Leverage public and private resources to support homeless services
- Apply a data-driven approach to the deployment of resources
