### Sales and Use Tax Revenue Update

#### **Sales and Use Tax**

#### May 2021 compared to May 2020

- Retail sales taxes 1 43%
- General use taxes 173%
- Motor vehicle taxes 173%

#### May 2021 compared to May 2019

- Retail sales taxes 17%
- General use taxes 1 38%
- Motor vehicle taxes U 4%

#### Year-to-date compared to 2020

- Retail sales taxes 15%
- General use taxes 1 2%
- Motor vehicle taxes 1 22%

Year-to-date compared to 2019

- Retail sales taxes 10%
- General use taxes **U** 39%
- Motor vehicle taxes 1 8%

# Consolidation of Printer/Software

#### **Consolidation of Printer/Software**

- Currently, printer and software costs are included across all departments
- Consolidating costs into a centralized location will:
  - provide more visibility,
  - help manage costs and
  - identify redundant software
- A formal resolution to approve consolidation will be presented on July 20, 2021

## Release of 2021 Budget Proviso

#### **Release of 2021 Budget Proviso**

- \$100,000 budget proviso for post comprehensive plan strategic initiatives
- The current draft Goal #4 includes a feasibility study for a downtown improvement district
- A grant has been submitted for this feasibility study
- A formal resolution to release this budget proviso will be presented on July 20, 2021

## Restructuring of 2021 Budget

#### **Restructuring of 2021 Budget**

Several reorganization efforts in 2021

• Timing of these efforts did not align with preparation of the 2021 budget

 Staff will be aligning financial information with these efforts going forward

#### American Rescue Plan Act Funds

#### **American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)**

- Law passed March 11, 2021
- Provides funding to all 19,000 municipalities
- Distribution from State
  - 1<sup>st</sup> half approx. June 2021
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> half approx. June 2022
- Must use funds by December 31, 2024
- U. S. Treasury to provide clarification on use of funds
- Required reporting to U. S. Treasury

#### **Use of Funds**

Defined uses per American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

- A. to respond to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID–19) or its negative economic impacts, including assistance to households, small businesses, and nonprofits, or aid to impacted industries such as tourism, travel, and hospitality;
- B. to respond to workers performing essential work during the COVID–19 public health emergency by providing **premium pay to eligible workers** of the metropolitan city, nonentitlement unit of local government, or county that are performing such essential work, or by providing grants to eligible employers that have eligible workers who perform essential work;
- C. for the **provision of government services** to the extent of the **reduction in revenue** of such metropolitan city, nonentitlement unit of local government, or county **due to the COVID–19 public health emergency** relative to revenues collected in the most recent full fiscal year of the metropolitan city, nonentitlement unit of local government, or county prior to the emergency; or
- D. to make necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure.

#### **ARPA Update**

- Littleton received \$6m in June 2021 and will receive \$6m in June 2022; total of approx. \$12m
- This is higher than the original estimate of \$10.3m
- The city has some immediate needs in 2021
- Many organizations remain cautious on rushing to spend funds
- An ordinance on 1st reading will be presented on July 20 to appropriate the first payment of approx. \$6m and authorize the use of funds in 2021 as listed
