This is a threat to property adjacent to Lee Gulch. Second there are several bridges that were built too low and currently obstruct the flow during storms.	Stream walls need to be reinforced with heavy bolder walls in areas that land/homeowners are adjacent to the meandering stream.	When flooding happens along Lee Gulch the trail fill (clay rock mix) is carried into the channel creating problems for aquatic life and adjacent property deposition/erosion. SSPR always adds more of this mix to patch the trail system after heavy rains. It seems like this "illegal stream fill" needs to be addressed. Adding the trail fill to the stream suspension load (the debris carried in the water) creates problems. Perhaps a system needs to be designed that prevents the trail fill from being swept into the creek.
