6. Comments / Reports

a) Council Members

Council Member Reichardt - Paving in front of his house is going well and he is grateful. Thanked South Metro Fire representatives Chelsea Molitor & Chief Burke and former Council Member Bruce Stahlman for taking the time to walk through Ketring Park regarding fire safety. Thanked Transportation and Mobility Board for studying and talking to officials in 7 cities about Vision 0. They are close to presenting to council. Thanked Next Generation Advisory Board for the work they are putting in with groups in the city.

Council Member Grove - Attended Littleton Chamber ribbon cutting for W.E. O'Neil Construction. They moved to Littleton from Denver and would allow someone to put a mural on their building. Also attended East Community Center ribbon cutting. They are open to non-profits. Participated in the Littleton Leadership Academy on April 19, 2024 and discussed campaigning and what it's like to be on council. Attended the State of the City for Centennial and there were over 300 people in attendance. Historic Littleton Inc. gives historic tours on the first Friday of the month and discuss the buildings in Littleton.

Council Member Peters - She attended the 25th Anniversary Memorial for Columbine High School with Mayor Schlachter. Attended the river clean up program on Saturday.

Council Member Rydin - Screened a documentary with Krista Kafer and had a workshop afterwards. The homework for attendees were to report out interactions regarding the documentary and how the interactions go. Attended and spoke at the Littleton Business Chamber's Women in Leadership. Littleton Business Chamber

and Englewood Business Chamber are holding a joint event at Platte River Bar & Grill tomorrow. Thanked everyone who attended the Final Friday event. Farmers market on Nevada will be held the first and third Sunday of the month from 11:00am - 3:00pm. The Littleton Downtown Development Authority has just launched a welcome packet for new businesses in Littleton. The Tri Cities Policy Work Group is meeting in person this Thursday from 7:45am - 9:00am at Sheridan City Hall. Littleton Arts & Culture Board is meeting on Thursday at 6:30pm at the museum.

Council Member Driscoll - No report

b) Mayor Pro Tem

USA Today released the Top 5 cities to move to in Colorado and Littleton is #2. Highline Canal Conservancy is looking for public & private funding to preserve the Highline Canal. Attended the DRCOG annual retreat and it was a good discussion on wide ranging topics. Discussed the regional housing needs assessment and will finish up and will move on to a strategy document in July. DRCOG is having difficulty with senior services and now cities may be picking up more of those services.

c) City Manager

The latest on research options for meeting the needs of residents of Meadowood Village. There has been contact from Wolhurst Mobile Home Park with a similar situation as well. The city doesn't have a designated funding source available for these issues, but staff is researching options that may help. Had a productive meeting with Thistle Rock a non-profit who facilitates financing that helps resident ownership deals. A study session is being planned for May 28, 2024 to discuss how council wants to proceed with regard to these communities. Safer Streets Littleton progress includes 2024 pilot infrastructure projects, crosswalk painting, school zones & traffic calming short term changes, staff will compile priorities before the next school year. Speed feedback signs are being installed which will begin cautioning drivers. Police education enforcement is being planned next fall. An offer has been made to someone for the Transportation Planner position. The transportation engineer is in the process of being advertised. There was about a thousand people who attended the Sheep to Shawl Event at the museum. Matt Knight is the new Community Development Director and he is well qualified.

d) City Attorney

Updates to the states legislative session which ends tomorrow. CML had worked to keep up to date with several items. The ADU bill would add more accessory buildings. We are watching items closely. Minimum parking requirements is another bill going through which would affect commercial and residential developments. 1313 is going through which focused on increasing density around transit areas. It would require density increases but there have been many amendments to the original. All three bills help erode city land use control.
