

PURPOSE

- Create an easier to navigate code.
- Clarify license classification types.
- Standardize testing, eliminating the need to rely on other jurisdiction's testing standards.
- Add Right of Way and Arborist licensing to Community Development, thereby housing all contractor licensing in one Department and database.
- Update insurance amounts to match industry standard.
- Adjust fees to match the adopted 2025 fee schedule, which is based upon actual processing costs.
- Update the license suspension criteria to include non-payment of fees.



- Added a Table of Contents for easier navigation.
- Added Definitions for clarification.
- Added Arborist Licensing, this will now be administered by Community Development.
- Added a Class M (Municipal) Right of Way Contractor License.
 This type of license will now be administered by Community Development.



Updated the fee schedule.

Class A \$100

Class B \$100

Class C \$100

Class D \$100

Class M \$400

Arborist \$150

Electrician \$0 (State Regulated)

Plumber \$50

Added Definitions for Contractor Classes.



- Eliminated reciprocal licensing with other jurisdictions.
- Instituted standardized testing through the International Code Council for Class A,B,C, Class D Roofing, and HVAC.
- State licenses required for Electrical, Plumbing, and Manufactured Homes.
- Contractor licenses now expire at the end of the calendar year to align with industry standard and software limitations.



- Current ICC or State License must be current to renew. ICC exams are good for 3 years and can be renewed using continuing education credits to stay current.
- Updated insurance threshold amounts for contractors.
 \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$2,000,000 aggregate
- Added clarification of license suspension criteria to add nonpayment of fees.
