Ballot Question 300 – Retail Marijuana

A citizen initiative that gathered enough signatures to qualify for the ballot that will allow existing medical marijuana center licensees in the City of Littleton to sell retail marijuana on and after January 1, 2021.

Initiated Ballot Question 300 - Retail Marijuana

Yes: 17,057 (64.8%)

No: 9,260 (35.1%)

November 10th Study Session

- On November 10th, City Council had a study session to discuss this ballot measure and to provide direction on the following:

1. Did City Council wish to clarify or amend the buffer zones?

- Council direction was to not amend the buffer zones or add a definition of park/public park, but wished to allow the existing locations to convert

November 10th Study Session Cont.

2. Did City Council wish to add additional retail marijuana locations outside of the 3 that the voters approved?
 - Direction: Council did not express an interest in having more than 3 retail at this time.

3-20-1 Medical Marijuana Center Changes

- Clarified that buffer zone calculations included locations outside the City.
- Clarified that the existing Medical Marijuana Centers at their present locations were in conformance to the licensing code and land use code.

3-21-1 Retail Marijuana Changes

- Removed prohibition on retail.
- Added licensing requirements for the 3 medical marijuana centers that would be allowed to either sell both retail or medical or transfer to just retail.
- Added clarification on the transfer of licenses should an existing licensee wish to transfer their license.
