6. Comments / Reports

a) Council Members

Council Member Driscoll - No report

Council Member Zink - No report

Council Member Reichardt - Thanked the Tri-Cities Homelessness Initiative and attended the Bridge House ribbon cutting. Attended the Honnibrook Meadery ribbon cutting. This new meadery, along with our distillery and breweries, makes downtown a vibrant area. Wants to address the issue with Littleton Brewery to avoid similar parking issues in the future. Wants to look at fines and towing and possible permit parking to help with parking issues. Garbage pick up in the areas of difficult parking is also an issue to be addressed.

Council Member Grove - Participated in Cycling Without Age event called the "Art of the Sizzle". Took the participants through Hudson Gardens and then to a Latin lunch. State of the City was last week and people came from our community and other communities to hear what was happening in Littleton. Also attended the Ladies Only Sample Tour where ladies went from business to business to learn about each. The Arapahoe County Art Guild will be having a showing at Bemis Public Library for the month of June. There is a new mural at 5527 S. Hill St. Attended the ribbon cutting at the new meadery and it was really nice and encouraged everyone to go there. Each council member has a SET officer they can talk to about concerns that arise from citizens. Bega Australia is Littleton's sister city and every 5 years they come here or a delegation goes there. There is a program where a high-school student (junior or senior) gets an all expense paid trip to Australia and gives a presentation to their council.

Mayor Pro Tem Barr - Has attended the Arapahoe County Youth Awards for the past 5 years. This group gives scholarships to youth that have overcome challenges in their life. This year there were so many students who finished their education at Epic Campus. Epic Campus is really filling a gap in our community. Hearing the stories of these young people who have experienced adversity was really meaningful.

b) Mayor

Thanked the audience for attending and speaking. Announced Bruce Stahlman's passing and wanted to honor him. There will be a service for Bruce on May 31st at the Methodist church. Encouraged people to read the article about Bruce in the Littleton Independent. Spoke at the State of the City which was well attended. Attended the Mile High Flood District Bus Tour. Went by Reynolds Landing to see the work being done there. Talked about the Jackass Hill Gulch Watershed they are doing. Last day of LPS is Friday. Congratulated all the graduates and the kids finishing the school year. Reminded drivers that kids will be out and walking and biking and to watch for them. Asked council if there was interest regarding a study

session regarding a petition going around about a two year pause of code changes in our charter (Council agreed to discuss at a study session).

c) City Manager

Echoed the Mayor's concern about the kids being out of school. This is a top priority of staff to make streets safer. There will be a very public study of Elati street to evaluate what the best long term solution is. The staff met with the project team to assess current conditions. The consultant is gearing up for an online process from May 26 to June 22 to gather community input. Our transportation team is preparing for the next Safer Streets Littleton initiative. There has been progress with Geneva Village residents as the last resident has found new housing. Acknowledged the passing of Bruce Stahlman creating a vacancy on the District 4 seat for the South Metro Fire Board. Encouraged interested Littleton residents to apply by June 9, 2025. In response to citizen comments, stated that our planning staff has the necessary education, experience and professionalism needed for their respective positions and decision making.

d) City Attorney

Reminded everyone that as we approach election season to check with the city clerk regarding campaign donations. Governor Polis vetoed HB 25-1147 the "Fairness and Transparency in Municipal Court" initiative which would have limited the city's ability to properly sentence persons who violate city ordinances. Municipal and county courts are thankful for the Governor's support.
