7 **A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LITTLETON,**
8 **COLORADO, APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT**
9 **WITH THE CITIES OF ENGLEWOOD, LITTLETON, SHERIDAN, AND**
10 **THE COUNTY OF ARAPAHOE, COLORADO, TO CONTINUE THE TRI-**
11 **CITIES HOMELESSNESS COORDINATOR POSITION AND RELATED**
12 **TRI-CITIES ACTION PLAN PROJECTS**

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14 **WHEREAS**, Article XIV, Section 18 (2)(a) of the Constitution of the State of
15 Colorado, and Part 2, Article 1, Title 29, C.R.S., encourages and authorizes intergovernmental
16 agreements; and

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18 **WHEREAS**, Sections 29-1-203 and 29-1-203.5, C.R.S., authorizes governments
19 to cooperate and contract with one another to provide any function, service, or facility lawfully
20 authorized to each; and

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22 **WHEREAS**, the Cities and County are all experiencing an increase in
23 homelessness in their communities; and

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25 **WHEREAS**, in 2019 the Cities along with the County, engaged the University of
26 Denver Graduate School of Social Work to perform an initial assessment which interviewed and
27 analyzed data from both single persons and families experiencing homelessness; and

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29 **WHEREAS**, with the conclusion of the initial assessment, the Parties engaged
30 Florence Aliese Advancement Network, LLC, to develop an incremental operational plan
31 organized into priority areas, such as family homelessness and governance, with recommendation
32 for action steps based on national and regional best practices; and

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34 **WHEREAS**, a written Tri-Cities Homelessness Plan of Action (“Action Plan”)
35 developed by Florence Aliese Advancement Network, LLC, identified stakeholder roles and
36 responsibilities and identified current and/or potential future funding opportunities including
37 strategic steps based on regional and national best practices and local culture, to create a solid
38 foundation for a coordinated response system; and

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40 **WHEREAS**, the Cities have updated and rewritten the Tri-Cities Homeless Plan
41 of Action (“Action Plan”) to reflect work completed by the Tri-Cities Homeless Coordinator over
42 the last two-year period and to reflect the focus of the work for the upcoming two-year period; and

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44 **WHEREAS**, the Action Plan was adopted by the Cities and calls for the
45 establishment of a Tri-Cities Homelessness Coordinator (“Coordinator”) to coordinate the
46 implementation of the Action Plan in a manner to ensure connection to homelessness work, Tri-

47 Cities goals and regional best practices; and

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49 **WHEREAS**, in order to do so, the Parties must enter into an Intergovernmental
50 Agreement to fund the estimated cost of \$487,500 over two years as follows: The City of Littleton
51 shall pay \$275,000, the City of Englewood shall pay \$170,000, and the City of Sheridan shall pay
52 \$42,500 over two years with Arapahoe County’s share provided in-kind, through providing
53 employment, oversight, materials, equipment/supplies, and a workplace.

55 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF**
56 **THE CITY OF LITTLETON, COLORADO, THAT:**

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58 **Section 1.** The Intergovernmental Agreement between the Cities of Englewood,
59 Littleton, Sheridan, and the County of Arapahoe, Colorado, for the continuation of a Tri-Cities
60 Homelessness Coordinator position and related Tri-Cities Homelessness Action Plan projects
61 attached hereto as “Exhibit A”, is hereby accepted and approved by the City Council of the City
62 of Littleton, Colorado.
