**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
LITTLETON, COLORADO, AUTHORIZING A GRANT APPLICATION
TO THE COLORADO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR THE
PRINCE STREET LINK PROJECT**

WHEREAS, the City of Littleton as part of its Transportation Master Plan has established objectives of providing a reliable and high-quality multimodal transportation system and achieving a balanced mode share; and

WHEREAS, the city's Transportation Master Plan included an objective to provide a safe and low stress biking/walking environment; and

WHEREAS, the city desires to further the implementation of capital projects identified in this plan and improve safety and mobility for all users of our transportation network; and

WHEREAS, the Colorado Department of Transportation provides funding for such projects through its Safer Main Streets Program; and

WHEREAS, the City of Littleton will be requesting \$1,565,100 for the Prince Street Link Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF LITTLETON, COLORADO, THAT:**

1. The City Council of the City of Littleton strongly supports the grant application for the Prince Street Link Project.
2. The City Council of the City of Littleton anticipates an appropriation to cover the \$312,220 in matching funds for said grant with an amendment to the current budget or in the ensuing fiscal year budget and subsequently authorizes the expenditure of funds necessary to meet the terms and obligations of the awarded grant.
3. The city commits to completing the Prince Street Link Project, if the grant is awarded.
4. The project site is owned by the City of Littleton.
5. If the grant is awarded, the City of Littleton acknowledges responsibility of cost overruns for the Prince Street Link Project.
6. If the grant is awarded, the City Council of the City of Littleton hereby authorizes the City Manager to sign the grant agreement and grant records with the Colorado Department of Transportation.

- 47 7. The City of Littleton will continue to maintain the constructed facilities in a
48 high-quality condition, and in accordance with all terms, conditions and
49 obligations contained in the intergovernmental agreement.
