**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
LITTLETON, COLORADO, AUTHORIZING A GRANT APPLICATION
TO THE DENVER REGIONAL COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS FOR
THE BROADWAY FIBEROPTICS COMMUNICATION FOR REGIONAL
TRAFFIC OPERATIONS PROJECT**

WHEREAS, the City of Littleton as part of its Transportation Master Plan has established objectives of providing a reliable and high-quality transportation system, and providing a resilient and responsive traffic operations system; and

WHEREAS, the city's Transportation Master Plan included a proposed project which identifies the need for Intelligent Transportation System technologies along the Broadway corridor; and

WHEREAS, the city's Fiberoptic Master Plan identified the installation of fiberoptic cable along the Broadway corridor as a Tier 1 project; and

WHEREAS, the city desires to further the implementation of capital projects identified in these two plans; and

WHEREAS, the Denver Regional Council of Governments provides funding for such projects through its Regional Transportation Operations & Technology Program; and

WHEREAS, the City of Littleton will be requesting \$556,000 for the Broadway Fiberoptics Communication for Regional Traffic Operations project, which will construct fiberoptic cable on Broadway from Powers Avenue to Arapahoe Road and on Arapahoe Road from Broadway to Pennsylvania Street.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF LITTLETON, COLORADO, THAT:**

1. The City Council of the City of Littleton strongly supports the grant application for the Broadway Fiberoptics Communication for Regional Traffic Operations project.
2. The City Council of the City of Littleton anticipates an appropriation to cover the \$111,200 in matching funds for said grant with an amendment to the current budget or in the ensuing fiscal year budget and subsequently authorizes the expenditure of funds necessary to meet the terms and obligations of the awarded grant.
3. The city commits to completing the Broadway Fiberoptics Communication for

Regional Traffic Operations project, if the grant is awarded.

4. The project site is owned by the City of Littleton.
5. If the grant is awarded, the City of Littleton acknowledges responsibility of cost overruns for the Broadway Fiberoptics Communication for Regional Traffic Operations project.
6. If the grant is awarded, the City Council of the City of Littleton hereby authorizes the City Manager to sign the grant agreement and grant records with the Denver Regional Council of Governments and/or the Colorado Department of Transportation.
7. The City of Littleton will continue to maintain the constructed facilities in a high-quality condition, and in accordance with all terms, conditions and obligations contained in the intergovernmental agreement.
8. This resolution is in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
