

The Arapahoe County Assessor reports a 1955 date of construction for this building. The building is not on the 1949 Sanborn Insurance map; the Roth Motor Company paint and body shop appears at this location in the 1955 city directory (addressed as 342 W. Main St.). A July 1955 photograph shows a paint and body shop in what appears to be the location of this building. The Brad Bradford Auto Body Co. is listed here in the 1959 city directory and is still operating at the location today. George N. Bradford is the current owner.
