17 18	WHEREAS, the Bridge House Ready to Work Program located at 4675 S.		
19	Windermere Street in Englewood provides transitional employment, housing, and support services		
20	to individuals experiencing homelessness, serving clients from across the region; and

22	WHEREAS, on a year-round basis, Bridge House in Englewood serves 49		
23	individuals formerly experiencing homelessness in its Ready to Work Program and another 20		
24	people currently experiencing homelessness in the Tri Cities Navigation Center operated by Bridge		
25	House; and		
26	WHEDEAS access to valiable within the production is acceptial for Deady to Work		
27 28	<b>WHEREAS</b> , access to reliable public transportation is essential for Ready to Work participants to obtain and maintain employment, access healthcare, and attend appointments and		
28 29	community services necessary for successful reentry and reintegration; and

31	WHEREAS, the current lack of a bus stop within close walking distance of 4675		
32	S. Windermere Street presents a significant barrier to clients and staff of the program, limiting		
33	equitable access to regional transit services; and

36 37	transit accessibility for vulnerable populations and recognize the value of coordinated regional efforts to address homelessness and unemployment.

42	Section 1. The Cities jointly and respectfully request that the Regional Transportation		
43	District (RTD) evaluate and take necessary steps to establish a bus stop serving the		
44	Bridge House Ready to Work Program facility at 4675 S. Windermere Street in		
45	Englewood.		

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46 47	Section 2. The proposed bus stop should be considered a priority due to its significance in advancing regional goals of equitable access to transportation, economic opportunity,		
48 49	and social services. Section 3. The Cities affirm their willingness to collaborate with RTD staff to facilitate		
50 51	site evaluations, discuss routing options, and address infrastructure or safety considerations as necessary.
