

PUBLIC PERCEPTION / AESTHETICS

 - Overgrown Veg

ENVIRONMENTAL DEGRADATION

- Impacts to vegetation
 - Impacts to soil/erosion
 - Impacts to water quality
 - Hazardous materials (propane, petroleum products, pre-cursor material, etc)
 - Bio Hazards (used needles, etc)
 - General health hazards (LA Hepatitis outbreak)








WHAT CAN WE DO?
