8	COLORADO, ALLOCATING 2025 STADIUM DISTRICT FUNDING
9	GRANTS, 2025 LOCAL PARTNERSHIP FUNDING GRANTS, AND 2025
10	ARTS & CULTURE BOARD LODGERS TAX FUNDING GRANTS, AND
11	APPROVING COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS TO AWARD GRANTS

13	WHEREAS, Littleton has historically provided funding in the form of cash
14	donations and in-kind services to organizations that serve Littleton residents through a competitive
15	grant application process managed by the Littleton City staff and approved by Littleton City
16	Council; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, each year the Littleton City Council considers requests for Local
19	Partnership Funding (LPF) grants from organizations for operational expenses, one-time special
20	purpose grants, or event sponsorships for cash or in-kind services. LPF grants will not be awarded
21	for debt or deficit reduction, events outside the Littleton city limits, capital improvements, for-
22	profit events and/or activities, and are limited to a maximum of \$25,000 annually. LPF grants will
23	be distributed in 2025; and
24	WIIEDEAC the City of Littleton was awarded one time Stedium District Funds
25 26	WHEREAS, the City of Littleton was awarded one-time Stadium District Funds (SDF) in the amount of \$1,229,200.72 from the Metropolitan Football Stadium District (District),
27	the entity that owns Empower Field at Mile High, with the funds designated to be used for "youth
28	activity" programs. Littleton City Council placed the same restrictions on the SDF funds as LPF
29	funds which will not be awarded for debt or deficit reduction, events outside the Littleton city
30	limits, capital improvements, or for-profit events and/or activities, in addition to the additional
31	restriction that the grant awards must be used for "youth activities." There is not a maximum award
32	amount restricted for the SDF grant amount. SDF grants will be distributed in 2025. Should funds
33	remain undistributed, they would remain in the SDF fund balance with the expectation that they
34	would be awarded and spent in the following year unless Littleton City Council approves an
35	extension; and
36	
37	WHEREAS, in November 2022, Littleton citizens approved the creation of a 5%
38	Lodgers Tax on hotels, motels, and short-term rental hosts within the city limits. The revenue from
39	this tax will support and sustain arts and culture, tourism, and visitor promotion in the Littleton
40	city limits. Collection of the Lodgers Tax began in January 2023, and the second annual
41	distribution of the revenue is scheduled for 2025. Should funds remain undistributed, they would remain in the Lodgers Tay fund belongs with the expectation that they would be spent in the
42 43 44	remain in the Lodgers Tax fund balance with the expectation that they would be spent in the following year unless Littleton City Council approves an extension. Lodgers Tax grants will be distributed in 2025; and

WHEREAS, grantees will be asked to sign an acknowledgement prior to accepting

the grant pledging that the funds will be expended within the City of Littleton; and

WHEREAS, grantees will be asked to sign an acknowledgement prior to accepting the grant, that they agree to submit a grant progress report within six months. If any awarded funds have not been used after six months, the report must be submitted within a year of receiving the grant award. The grant progress report is not intended to be overly burdensome for the grant recipients and should contain a summary of the program, how funds were used, results and impacts, lessons learned, and future plans. Any grant funds awarded and not spent within 18 months of receipt must be returned to the City of Littleton. If a grant progress report is not received before the opening date of grants being advertised the following year, the current grant recipient will not be eligible to apply for grant funding the following year; and

**WHEREAS**, grant awards will be adjusted to be no greater than the applicant's requested award amount; and

WHEREAS, Littleton City staff should seek experienced non-profit partners as a community partnership, to receive funds on behalf of less experienced applicants that are not registered as non-profit organizations in the State of Colorado. Grant recipients and a non-profit organization must be agreeable for the existing, experienced non-profit organization to pass the funding through their organization thereby ensuring the appropriate financial controls are in place; and

**WHEREAS**, Littleton City Council understands that staff recommendations to award grant reductions for current and future grants may be necessary based on the existing budget limitations, but it is council's intention to award as much of the allocated annual budget as possible; and

**WHEREAS,** Littleton City Council will follow these guidelines should future grant funds become available to award to organizations serving Littleton citizens.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LITTLETON, COLORADO, THAT:

Allocating 2025 Stadium District Funding grants, 2025 Local Partnership Funding grants, and 2025 Arts & Commission Lodgers Tax Funding grants, and approving community partnerships to award grants, is adopted.
