A RESOLUTION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LITTLETON, COLORADO, RECOMMENDING APPROVAL OF AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE SIGN CODE, CHAPTER 17, TITLE 10 TO ADDRESS HUMAN SIGNS AND ROTATING SIGNS.

WHEREAS, the planning commission of the City of Littleton, Colorado, held a public hearing at its regular meeting of September 10, 2018 to consider a proposed ordinance amending the sign code, Chapter 17 of Title 10, of the city code regarding human signs and rotating signs, more specifically described in Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof by this reference;

WHEREAS, the planning commission considered evidence and testimony concerning the proposed ordinance at said public hearing;

WHEREAS, the planning commission finds that the proposed ordinance is consistent with the city’s comprehensive plan; and

WHEREAS, the planning commission finds that the proposed ordinance is in the best interest of the city and will promote the public health, safety, and welfare of its inhabitants;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LITTLETON, COLORADO, THAT:

Section 1. The planning commission does hereby recommend that city council approve the proposed ordinance, more specifically described in Exhibit A, amending Title 10 of the Zoning Code, Section 10-17-4, regarding Sign Code Definitions, and Section 10-17-6-2, to Add Definitions for Human Signs and Rotating Signs, with the following condition:

- 1) to change line 47 of first page of the draft ordinance to include the word "TEMPORARY" to "rotating signs."

INTRODUCED BY COUNCILMEMBERS:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LITTLETON, COLORADO, AMENDING TITLE 10 OF THE ZONING CODE, SECTION 10-17-4, REGARDING SIGN CODE DEFINITIONS, AND SECTION 10-17-6-2, TO ADD DEFINITIONS FOR HUMAN SIGNS AND ROTATING SIGNS

WHEREAS, the planning commission, at its regular meeting on September 10, 2018, held a public hearing and voted to recommend approval of an ordinance amending Title 10 of the Zoning Code, Section 10-17-4, regarding Sign Code Definitions, and Section 10-17-6-2, to Add Definitions for Human Signs and Rotating Signs; and

WHEREAS, the city council considered evidence and testimony concerning the proposed zoning code changes at a public hearing;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LITTLETON, COLORADO, THAT:

Section 1: Title 10, Chapter 17, Section 4 of the Littleton City Code pertaining to Zoning: Definitions is amended to add the following listed specific words and terms defined as follows:

HUMAN SIGNS: A SIGN THAT IS CONTINUOUSLY HELD, SPUN, OR ATTACHED TO A PERSON THAT ADVERTISES A BUSINESS, COMMODITY, SERVICE OR PRODUCT, INCLUDING PERSONS DRESSED AS MASCOTS.

ROTATING SIGN: A SIGN IN WHICH THE SIGN ITSELF OR ANY PORTION OF THE SIGN MOVES IN A REVOLVING OR SIMILAR MANNER. SUCH MOTION DOES NOT REFER TO METHODS OF CHANGING COPY.

Section 2: Title 10, Chapter 17, Section 6-2 of the Littleton City Code pertaining to Sign Code is amended to read as follows:

10-17-6-2: SIGNS PROHIBITED AND SIGNS ALLOWED BY SPECIAL PERMIT:

(A) Signs Prohibited: The following signs shall not be permitted in any zone district:

1. ~~Reserved~~ ROTATING SIGNS.
2. Portable signs and portable sandwich board signs except as specifically permitted in

1 subsection 10-17-6-5(C) of this chapter;

3 3. Roof signs; or roof illumination designed to illuminate signs located elsewhere on the
4 building. A building element constructed to only contain a sign shall not be permitted;

6 4. Billboards, as defined in this chapter, except as specifically permitted in subsections 10-
7 17-6-6(H) of this chapter;

9 5. Price signs at gasoline service stations except as authorized by subsection 10-17-6-5(F)4
10 of this chapter;

12 6. Other signs: No person shall erect any sign except as authorized by this chapter or other
13 ordinance of the city and then only in accordance with the provisions thereof.

15 (B) Signs Allowed By Special Permit:

16

17 1. The following signs shall be allowed for an individual business located in any business,
18 transitional, CA, or industrial zone district by special permit. Not more than two (2) four (4)
19 permits may be issued each calendar year for a cumulative period of not more than sixty (60)
20 one hundred and twenty (120) days.

22 a. Hot air balloons and other types of lighter than air objects;

23

24 b. Banners, feather banners or wind signs;

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26 c. Flags that are not the flag of the United States, any foreign nation, any state or
27 political subdivision of the United States or political subdivision of this state or flag
28 of a political entity having existed in the United States having historical or cultural
29 significance.

30

31 (C) Portable sandwich board signs shall be allowed in accordance with the provisions of this
32 code by special permit. The application for the permit shall be filed with the community
33 development department, together with the required fee.

34

35 (D) Murals shall be allowed in accordance with the provisions of this code by special
36 permit. The application shall be filed with the community development department together
37 with the required fee.

38

39 (E) Subdivision Entrance Sign: one permanent subdivision entrance sign shall be allowed. In
40 residential subdivisions, such sign shall be limited to a maximum size of twenty (20) square feet
41 per display face and shall not exceed two (2) faces per sign. In commercial and industrial
42 subdivisions, such sign shall be limited to a maximum size of fifty (50) square feet per display
43 face and shall not exceed two (2) faces per sign.

45 (F) Signs inside display windows visible from the street that are designed to advertise the
46 business as compared to merchandise or displays are not covered by this exception.

47

48 (G) HUMAN SIGNS:

49

- 1 1. MAY NOT EXCEED 2 FEET BY 4 FEET IN SIZE;
- 2
- 3 2. MAY NOT BLOCK INGRESS AND EGRESS ON ANY DRIVEWAY ENTRANCE
- 4 FROM A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE STREET INTO A PARCEL;
- 5
- 6 3. MAY NOT OBSTRUCT THE PUBLIC SIDEWALK DENYING ACCESS TO
- 7 PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES;
- 8
- 9 4. REQUIRE AN ANNUAL PERMIT FROM THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT
- 10 DEPARTMENT;
- 11
- 12 5. MAY NOT BE PLACED OUTSIDE THE LIMITS ESTABLISHED ON THE PERMIT.
- 13

14 **Section 3:** Severability. If any part, section, subsection, sentence, clause or
 15 phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the
 16 validity of the remaining sections of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it
 17 would have passed this ordinance, including each part, section, subsection, sentence, clause or
 18 phrase hereof, irrespective of the fact that one or more parts, sections, subsections, sentences,
 19 clauses or phrases may be declared invalid.

21 **Section 4:** Repealer. All ordinances or resolutions, or parts thereof, in
 22 conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed, provided that this repealer shall not repeal the
 23 repealer clauses of such ordinance nor revive any ordinance thereby.
