


WHAT IS A PERCENT FOR PUBLIC ART PROGRAM?



Percent for Public Art programs allocate a small portion of municipal capital improvement budgets (usually 1.0%) for the purchase, installation, and maintenance of public art. In the US, there are more than 350 Percent for Art programs (the first established in Philadelphia in 1959). Governance and management systems vary.

POLICY REVISIONS BASED ON FEEDBACK

- Draft policy only applied to public projects, does not include private development projects at this time
- 1% surcharge on all eligible public construction projects over \$500,000
- 1% calculated on actual expenditure total reconciled at end of fiscal year
- Excludes non-COL sources of funding (Federal, State, grants, etc.)
- Excludes temporary improvements, repair and maintenance, pavement management, etc.
- Artwork selection led by Public Art Subcommittee of the Arts & Culture Board
