Council Member Clark moved and Council Member Cole seconded to approve Mark Relph as the sole finalist and charge Waters and Company to negotiate a contract with Mark Relph for the City Manager position.

Council Member Cernanec moved and Mayor Pro Tem Brinkman seconded to table the motion on item 8(a) until June 6, 2017 or later, after the City Manager candidate interviews. Vote is 3-4, with Mayor Beckman and Council Members Cole, Clark and Valdes voting no. The motion fails.

Vote on the motion to direct Waters and Company to negotiate a contract with Mark Relph for the City Manager position is 4-3, with Mayor Pro Tem Brinkman, Council Members Cernanec and Hopping voting no. The motion carries.

Council Member Cole - Question to staff on status of bringing a motion to council regarding the amount of time allotted to citizens during public comment / North Littleton Promise Cinco de Mayo celebration

Council Member Clark - No report

Council Member Hopping - Review of council objectives from retreat on Friday; narrowed from 19 to 6. Amount of time for citizen comments was not one of the 6 / Feels it's appropriate to have public outreach during the fire discussion(s) but that we should also do that for the key hire (City Manager) in the city / Interested in council meetings with Boards and Commissions and Littleton Public Schools / Sandwich board sidewalk signs / Littleton Post Office needs work, i.e. paint, etc... Senator Mike Coffman visited, took pictures of the building and sent it to the Postmaster General / Pesticides used within the city - guidelines available on the city website

Council Member Cernanec - Interface with Boards and Commissions - only one is currently on the council tentative schedule / Pedal of Littleton has released a Spring and Summer guide for the Front Range / Thank you to Public Works Director Relph for last week's presentation / DRCOG annual awards banquet / Attended Water Now Alliance and shared the presentation materials with the acting city manager / Area Agency on Aging grants have been processed through the DRCOG Board - City of Littleton has not stepped up to qualify for some of these awards - interested in the

city becoming qualified for some of these grants / Each council member had an opportunity to meet one-on-one with the consultant in regards to the transfer of LFR to South Metro; feels strongly about public engagement

Council Member Valdes - Channel 8 is a good source to get information about Littleton including what to do when you come across a coyote when you're with your dog

Mayor Pro Tem Brinkman - No report

Council Retreat last week; spent a large amount of time in determining ways to get community input
