A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LITTLETON, COLORADO, AUTHORIZING AN APPLICATION TO THE ARAPAHOE COUNTY OPEN SPACES GRANT PROGRAM FOR A PLANNING GRANT FOR JACKASS GULCH'S RESTORATION AND STABILIZATION.

WHEREAS, the city of Littleton as part of its mission statement acquires and improves land within city boundaries to develop and provide park and recreation facilities for the public; and

WHEREAS, Arapahoe County provides funding for such projects through distribution of its Open Space Grant monies; and

WHEREAS, the city of Littleton has requested \$97,110 for the design of Jackass Gulch's restoration and stabilization and for the design of a detention and water quality pond at the upper end of the gulch from Arapahoe County Open Spaces; and

WHEREAS, Jackass Gulch is an outdoor open space open to the public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LITTLETON, COLORADO, THAT:

1. The City Council of city of Littleton strongly supports the grant application for the design of Jackass Gulch's restoration and stabilization.
2. The City Council of city of Littleton has authorized sufficient appropriation to cover the \$10,790 in matching funds for said Arapahoe County Open Space Grant and authorizes the expenditure of funds necessary to meet the terms and obligations of the awarded grant.
3. The city commits to completing the Jackass Gulch restoration and stabilization design project if the grant is awarded.
4. The project site is owned by the city of Littleton.
5. The city of Littleton will maintain the Jackass Gulch project in a high-quality condition after construction in cooperation with Mile High Flood District with their separate funding sources.

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6. If the grant is awarded, the city of Littleton acknowledges responsibility of cost overruns for the Jackass Gulch restoration and stabilization design project.
7. If the grant is awarded, the city council of the city of Littleton hereby authorizes the city Manager to sign the grant agreement and grant records with Arapahoe County.
8. This resolution is in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
