15	WHEREAS, the planning board, at its regular meeting on August 8, 2016, held a
16	public hearing and voted to recommend approval of an ordinance amending title 2 of the city
17	code to change the name of the planning board to planning commission; and

19	WHEREAS , the city council finds that the proposed amendments to the city code
20	are in the best interest of the city and will promote the public health, safety and welfare of its
21 22	inhabitants;
22 23	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF
23 24	THE CITY OF LITTLETON, COLORADO, THAT:

26	Section 1. Sections 1 and 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 2 are hereby revised as
27	follows:

29	2-2-1: CREATION.

31	There is hereby created a board of adjustment, a building board of appeals, a fine arts board, a
32	library board, a museum board, a planning board COMMISSION, a historical preservation board
33	and a licensing authority which shall hereinafter for the purposes of this title be referred to as
34	"boards and commissions".

36	2-2-6: MEETINGS:
37	(A) All boards and commissions, exponeting the microning board COMMISSION
38 39	(A) All boards and commissions, excepting the planning board COMMISSION, which shall meet twice each month when there is business to conduct, shall meet at least once
39 40	each month when there is business to conduct, at a time and location as agreed upon by the
40 41	membership. All meetings shall not be scheduled when regular city council meetings or study

43	(B) All boards and commissions shall have the authority to hold special meetings
