

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU)  
BETWEEN  
THE CITY OF LITTLETON  
AND  
LITTLETON/ENGLEWOOD BI-CITY WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT**

This document defines the ownership rights and maintenance obligations of the City of Littleton (“Littleton” or “the City”) and the Littleton Englewood Wastewater Treatment Plant (“L/E WWTP”) (Collectively “the Parties”) with regards to the “Littleton 66”” interceptor pipeline.

This MOU is effective in perpetuity from April \_\_\_\_, 2017 unless rescinded by mutual agreement of the parties.

1. The L/E WWTP is operated by the City of Englewood pursuant to the “Agreement Between the Cities of Littleton and Englewood, Colorado for Joint-Use Waste Water Treatment Facilities.” The original agreement was dated July 2, 1973. A subsequent amended agreement was dated December 6, 1982.

2. The ownership of the real estate and improvements on the L/E WWTP site are owned as a tenancy in common between the Cities (Contract Section 2.3).

3. The City of Littleton operates an interceptor sewer to transport wastewater from its service area to the L/E WWTP which was constructed as a 66” line from Littleton to the L/E WWTP (Contract Sections 1.7 and 7.5).

4. The point at which the Littleton interceptor changes from ownership by the City to ownership by the L/E WWTP is not clear from existing documentation. Neither the contracts nor the accompanying plats provide a specific location where the ownership transfer occurs and it is necessary to further define that location.

5. As designated on Exhibit A to this MOU, the ownership of the 66" interceptor, including responsibility for maintenance, repair, and replacement, will be vested in the City of Littleton from the siphon outlet structure designated as 1 to the first manhole structure on L/E WWTP property, as follows:

Littleton Interceptor: Ownership of the 66" interceptor by the City of Littleton is hereby confirmed from the siphon outlet structure designated as 1 to the L/E WWTP at the entrance to MH L-1.

The L/E WWTP will be responsible for the maintenance, repair and replacement of the interceptor and all manholes within the Plant property, except as noted above. A plat map of the Plant property is attached as Exhibit A with the MH L-1 manhole indicated where the agreed upon physical location for the separation of ownership and responsibility occurs.
