Council Member Cernanec moved and Council Member Hopping seconded to approve a resolution of the city council of the City of Littleton, Colorado, to establish a refund method for excess TABOR revenues from 2016, if the excess revenue TABOR question scheduled for the November 7, 2017 election fails. a) <u>Ordinance</u> <u>19-2017</u> An ordinance on second reading approving a rezoning of 6505-09 South Santa Fe Drive into the Santa Fe and Arapahoe General Planned Development Plan to allow for self-storage, garage condos, and a treatment facility with housing and mental health services.

Mayor Beckman opened the public hearing at 8 p.m.

Mike Robideau - Came here with reservations but is feeling better after presentations Debra Keller, Denver Seminary - concerned about building size and security Dan Arizumi - speaking on behalf of the property owner, Gary Sutton / in favor John Forhan Gary Sutton's Attorney - in favor John Hoesteroy - undecided Karina Elrod -opposed / support Planning Commission in completing the Santa Fe corridor plan Tammy Whitney - opposed Pam Chadbourne - opposed / Development Plan does not support this change of use by the river Don Bruns - opposed / not consistent with Complan/Santa Fe Corridor Plan Roger Auerbach - in favor of idea of "garage condo" / suggest amending plan to include a separate driveway for the mental health facility

Mayor Beckman closed the public hearing at 8:27 p.m.

Council Member Clark moved and Council Member seconded to approve on second reading an ordinance approving a rezoning of 6505-09 South Santa Fe Drive into the Santa Fe and Arapahoe General Planned Development Plan to allow for self-storage, garage condos, residential uses and a treatment facility with housing and mental health services with the following condition of approval: 1. That the RE (Residential - Estates) zoning and the existing houses and structures be allowed to remain as permitted uses until the first building permit for either the self-storage or garage condo is issued. 2. That Ordinance #20-2017 regarding the rezoning of the adjacent 2-99 acre Lee Gulch Overlook property also receives approval from the City Council - The motion dies for the lack of second.

Council Member Clark moved and Council Member Valdes seconded to approve on second reading an ordinance approving a rezoning of 6505-09 South Santa Fe Drive into the Santa Fe and Arapahoe General Planned Development Plan to allow for self-storage, garage condos, residential uses and a treatment facility with housing and mental health services with the following condition of approval: 1. That the RE (Residential - Estates) zoning and the existing houses and structures be allowed to remain as permitted uses until the first building permit for either the self-storage or garage condo is issued; 2. That ordinance #20 -2017 regarding the rezoning of the adjacent 2.99-acre Lee Gulch Overlook property also receives approval from the city council, which will satisfy minimum zone district size requirements for the property under section 10-12-2(A) of the city zoning code; 3. Minimum building set back from property line be 120 feet; 4. The height of the building be measured from the peak of the roof; and 5. the western edge of the property be screened with evergreen trees. The vote is 1-6, with Mayor Beckman, Mayor Pro Tem Brinkman, Council Member Cernanec, Council Member Cole, Council Member Hopping and Council Member Valdes voting no. The motion fails.
