8 9 10 11	AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LITTLETON, COLORADO, AMENDING CHAPTER 4 OF TITLE 6 OF THE LITTLETON MUNICIPAL CODE
12 13 14 15	WHEREAS , Senate Bill 17-008 amended C.R.S. §18-12-101 to remove the definitions of gravity knife and switchblade knife;
16 17 18	WHEREAS , Senate Bill 17-088 amended C.R.S. §18-12-102 to remove any references to gravity knives and switchblade knives; and
19 20 21	WHEREAS , the city wishes to update city code in compliance with these amendments to state statute.
22 23	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LITTLETON, COLORADO, THAT:
24 25	Section 1: Section 151 of Chapter 4 of Title 6 is hereby revised as follows:
262728	6-4-151: DEFINITIONS:
29 30	ADULT: Any person eighteen (18) years of age or older.
31 32 33	BALLISTIC KNIFE: Any knife that has a blade which is forcefully projected from the handle by means of a spring loaded device or explosive charge.
34 35 36 37	BLACKJACK: Any billy, sand club, sandbag or other hand operated striking weapon consisting, at the striking end, of an encased piece of lead or other heavy substance and, at the handle end, a strap or springy shaft which increases the force of impact.
38 39 40 41	BOMB: Any explosive or incendiary device or molotov cocktail as defined by state law, or any chemical device which causes or can cause an explosion, which is not specifically designed for lawful and legitimate use in the hands of its possessor.
42 43	DANGEROUS WEAPON: A firearm silencer, machine gun, short shotgun, short rifle, or ballistic knife.
44 45 46	DEADLY WEAPON: Any of the following which in the manner it is used or intended to be used is capable of producing death or serious bodily injury:
47	(A) A firearm, whether loaded or unloaded;

1 (B) A knife; 2 (C) A bludgeon; or 3 (D) Any other weapon, device, instrument, material, or substance, whether animate or 4 inanimate. 5 FIREARM SILENCER: Any instrument, attachment, weapon, or appliance for causing the firing 6 of any gun, revolver, pistol, or other firearm to be silent or intended to lessen or muffle the noise 7 of the firing of any such weapon. 8 9 GAS GUN: A device designed for projecting gas filled projectiles which release their contents 10 after having been projected from the device and includes projectiles designed for use in such a 11 device. 12 13 GRAVITY KNIFE: Any knife that has a blade released from the handle or sheath thereof by the 14 force of gravity or the application of centrifugal force. 15 16 HANDGUN: A pistol, revolver, or other firearm of any description, loaded or unloaded, from 17 which any shot, bullet, or other missile can be discharged, the length of the barrel of which, not 18 including any revolving, detachable, or magazine breech, does not exceed twelve inches (12"). 19 20 ILLEGAL WEAPON: A blackjack, bomb, firearm silencer, gas gun, nunchaku, machine gun, 21 short shotgun, short rifle, metallic knuckles, gravity knife, switchblade knife or throwing star. 22 23 JUVENILE: Any person under the age of eighteen (18) years. 24 25 KNIFE: Any dagger, dirk, knife, or stiletto with a blade over three and one-half inches $(3^{1}/2^{"})$ in 26 length, or any other dangerous instrument capable of inflicting cutting, stabbing, or tearing 27 wounds, but does not include a hunting or fishing knife carried for sports use. The issue that a 28 knife is a hunting or fishing knife must be raised as an affirmative defense. 29 30 MACHINE GUN: Any firearm, whatever its size and usual designation, that shoots automatically more than one shot, without manual reloading by a single function of the trigger. 31 32 33 NUNCHAKU: An instrument consisting of two (2) sticks, clubs, bars or rods to be used as 34 handles, connected by a rope, cord, wire, or chain, which is in the design of a weapon used in 35 connection with the practice of a system of self-defense. 36 37 SHORT RIFLE: A rifle having a barrel less than sixteen inches (16") long or an overall length of 38 less than twenty six inches (26"). 39 40 SHORT SHOTGUN: A shotgun having a barrel or barrels less than eighteen inches (18") long or 41 an overall length of less than twenty six inches (26"). 42 SWITCHBLADE KNIFE: Any knife, the blade of which opens automatically by hand pressure 43

THROWING STAR: A disk having sharp radiating points or any disk shaped blade object which

applied to a button, spring, or other device in its handle.

is handheld and thrown and which is in the design of a weapon used in connection with	the

Section 2: Section 152 of Chapter 4 of Title 6 is hereby revised as follows:

(A) It shall be unlawful for any person to wear under his clothes, or concealed about his person, or to display in a threatening manner, any dangerous or deadly weapon, including, but not by way of limitation, any pistol, revolver, slingshot, cross knuckles or knuckles of lead, brass or other metal, or any bowie knife, dirk, dagger or any knife resembling a bowie knife, or any knife described in section 6 4 154 of this chapter, or any other dangerous or deadly weapon.

Section 3: Section 154 of Chapter 4 of Title 6 is hereby revised as follows:

(A) Certain Knives Prohibited: It shall be unlawful for any person to sell, offer to sell, display, use, possess or carry any knife having the appearance of a pocketknife, the blade of which can be opened by a flick of a button, pressure on the handle or other mechanical contrivance.

Section 4: Severability. If any part, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance, including each part, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase hereof, irrespective of the fact that one or more parts, sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases may be declared invalid.

Section 5: Repealer. All ordinances or resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed, provided that this repealer shall not repeal the repealer clauses of such ordinance nor revive any ordinance thereby.
