Unification with South Metro Fire Rescue for improved emergency services and high quality roads

BACKGROUND

Formally dedicating funding for streets and infrastructure.

 February 3, 2018, council discussed long-term financial sustainability of the city

- Two major topics
 - Capital Costs
 - Fire/EMS service Costs

 Inclusion with SMFR allows the dedication of funding for streets and infrastructure

FUNDING

Inclusion allows reallocation of funds to streets and infrastructure

\$7.1M Fire costs

- \$4.0M Property tax reduction

\$3.1M Improved roads

IMPROVED ROADS

A portion of funds currently dedicated to fire service would be directed to City street and infrastructure improvements.



STRATEGIC APPROACH TO ROAD MAINTENANCE

Specifically: Streets and transportation related public infrastructure within the public right of way.



- 2014 report recommends \$4M annual maintenance budget
- Current Projected expenditures at \$1.4M
- Shortfal \$2.6M
