Asked council to table item with actions to gather more data. / Concerns on appeals process addressed in the Special Event ordinance under review in tonight's study session. / Agree's with Jeanie Erickson. Would like public comment to return to four minutes with 10 minutes available for scheduled public appearances. Carol Brzeczek - Ordinance 13-2018 - Opposed. Concerned that citizens have not had ample time to address issues/concerns. This is the first meeting that this appears on a regular meeting and a decision will be made in two weeks to abolish our fire department. The public should have been more involved in the discussion leading up to this agreement. It's not too late.

Frank Atwood - Ordinance 13-2018 - Opposed. Guiding principles: Littleton's interests have a higher priority than special interests. Feels city council is beholden to the residents over donors.

Marty Bolt - Ordinance 13-2018 - Opposed. / Shocked that council will not/does not respond to citizens during public comment. (This is addressed in the Mayor's opening statement regarding public comment regarding Colorado Open Meetings Law).
