10	WHEREAS, the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) was established by
11	Congress in 1965. The Act designated that a portion of receipts from offshore oil and gas leases
12	be placed into a fund annually for state and local conservation, as well as for the protection of
13	parks, forest, and wildlife areas; and

15	WHEREAS, in fiscal year 2018, LWCF received \$425 million. The program is
16	divided into two distinct funding streams: state grants and federal acquisition funds.
17	WHEREAC in Coloreda I WCE has arravided more than \$260 million in
18	WHEREAS, in Colorado, LWCF has provided more than \$268 million in
19 20	funding, and has leveraged more than \$147 million for local government and state park outdoor recreational investments in Colorado.

22	WHEREAS, in Colorado, outdoor recreation helps support Colorado's economy
23	by bringing in \$28 billion in consumer spending and 229,000 direct jobs for tourism and outdoor
24	recreation.

26	WHEREAS, preparation for natural disasters in Colorado is essential, and money
27	from LWCF is used to help prevent and remediate natural disasters like fires and floods.

29	WHEREAS, in Colorado, agriculture is important to the economy and our
30	Western heritage, and LWCF is essential in protecting agricultural land.

32	WHEREAS, for over 50 years, LWCF has played a critical role in providing
33	funding for conserving national parks and forests, rivers, farms and ranches, fish and wildlife,
34	sportsmen and recreation access and trails, and has additionally provided funding to conserve
35	state and local parks and facilities throughout Colorado and the nation, and should therefore be
36	fully funded.
