This spring there has been movement for the first time in many years on efforts to boost statewide transportation funding; these efforts have led to additional money to local communities in 2018 and 2019 (SB18-001). There are potential funding opportunities beyond 2019 if citizen Initiative 153 makes it to the ballot in November and is passed by voters. For historical purposes no statewide transportation ballot initiative has been passed since the adoption of TABOR in 1992. This is an outline of need versus opportunity in transportation funding resulting from the passage of Initiative 153.
