Action Plan

The City of Littleton Next Generation Advisory Committee (NGAC) provides City Council increased dialogue and engagement with, as well as insight on issues, both in Littleton and the region, from the 17-34 year old demographics' perspective. NGAC examines issues related to education, employment, economic opportunity, access to local government services, housing, the environment, transportation, city planning, codes, zoning, and overall increased civic engagement.

NGAC is made up of 7-11 members who live, work, or attend school in Littleton. Individuals who represent Littleton Public Schools can fill three positions; these positions are not required to be Littleton citizens. City Council wishes to have Arapahoe Community College represented by one member. Additionally, City Council seeks to have members who represent a variety of interests, and would like at least three but no more than seven members be residents of or employees in the City of Littleton.

NGAC Working Objectives

As the City works on updating the Comprehensive Plan, NGAC will support City Council, staff and the consultant by serving as a forum for subject matter experts. The role of NGAC is to provide input to City Council on policy matters including but not limited to:

- The Comprehensive Plan
- Comprehensive plan related elements (e.g. housing, parks and recreation, etc.)
- Public Awareness and Support for Innovation
- Transit/Transportation issues
- City policy as it relates to DRCOG Metrovision 2035 and Metrovision updates

The NGAC will serve as a forum for greater public engagement from an often less-engaged demographic. Members will spark ongoing discussions around the challenges, opportunities, and contributions of younger Littleton residents to encourage consideration of their viewpoint in public decision making.

NGAC Implementation Timeline

January 2019 – Resolution for committee creation

February/March 2019 – Marketing campaign (Twitter and Instagram focus) and applications

April 2019 – Committee member interviews and selection

May 2019 - First NGAC Meeting (Introduction to the group and intro to the City and Envision Littleton)

May – September 2019 – Board foundational education/Envision Littleton/Develop work plan
