

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: This house is associated with prominent Littleton residents such as E.D. Eson, Beulah Davies, and George Malcolm. The house is one of the best preserved example of the Dutch Colonial Revival style in Littleton, as reflected in the gambrel roof, front dormer, elaborated entrance, symmetrical facade, and porch with column supports.
