Subject: Intergovernmental Agreement among Centennial Water and Sanitation District,
City of Littleton and South Suburban Parks and Recreation District dated
6/8/2006.

As discussed at the Annual IGA Meeting held at CWSD's District Office Building on June 15, 2011, the CWSD Board of Directors has concluded that water-based programs or recreation on the reservoir itself pose considerable safety and liability issues and are, therefore, not prudent activities to engage in at the South Platte Reservoir. Therefore, no water based recreation activities will be allowed at the South Platte Reservoir. Consequently Paragraph 5, which describes the procedures for, and limitations of, water based activities, and the associated Exhibit C, will be replaced by the following:

5. Use of South Platte Reservoir for Water-based Recreation. No water based recreational activities are allowed.'

No water based recreational activities are allowed.


Receipt of this letter constitutes written notice of this termination action, and initiates the 90 day notice period consistent with the current IGA.

Exhibit C:

Allowed Recreational Uses of the South Platte Reservoir

- A. Water-based recreational uses will only be allowed following prior written approval by Centennial for each event on a case by case basis, and will generally be limited to canoeing. No other water-based recreational uses are allowed.
- B. Prohibited Recreational Uses:
 - 1. Swimming, floating;
 - 2. Wading;
 - 3. Animals, such as dogs and horses, within the reservoir;
 - 4. Snorkeling;
 - 5. Scuba diving;
 - 6. Fishing;
 - 7. Killing, trapping or other taking of any wildlife;
 - 8. Motorized boating;
 - 9. Wind Surfing;
 - 10. Hunting, discharge of firearms;
 - 11. Fireworks; and
 - 12. Any other activity not specifically authorized by Centennial.
