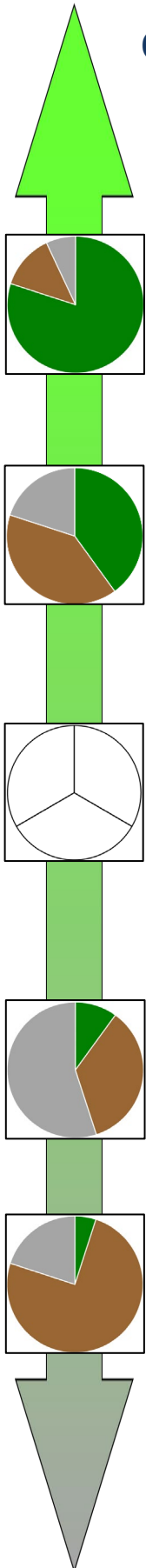


OVERVIEW: Future Land Use and Character Categories



Character

Estate: Greatest residential separation and openness, with limited land surface coverage.

Suburban: More land surface coverage, but balanced by green and open spaces.

Varies: A mix of character elements, or else should match character of immediate vicinity.

Auto Urban: Highest land surface coverage besides Urban, but mostly paving for vehicle circulation and parking versus a pedestrian orientation.

Urban: Least building setback and greatest "enclosure" of streets and spaces by buildings, creating walkable settings for pedestrians, with most green found in public spaces.

Pie charts show the **three elements of community character**, the extent of: (1) green space, (2) building coverage (brown), and (3) paved surfaces (gray).
