29	now routinely holds over 1,100 inmates and is structurally unable to safely continue to			
30	operate at that capacity; and

32	WHEREAS, public safety and the safety of the deputies of the Arapahoe County			
33	Sheriff's Office are critical issues to the residents of Arapahoe County; and

35	WHEREAS, the Arapahoe County Long Range Planning Committee, a bi-			
36	partisan citizens' task force of County residents, business and non-profit leaders			
37	appointed by the County Commissioners, recommends that the County needs a new			
38	detention and intake center; and
