THE 2020 CENSUS - NATIONAL

- The Census Bureau is the federal government's largest statistical agency
- Determines how many representatives each state gets in Congress and used to redraw district boundaries
- Distribute over \$675 billion in federal funds each year.
 - 16 federal assistance programs that receive funds based on the Census derived statistics

LOCAL STATISTICS

Littleton as of 2015: 46,352 residents

- Over \$8 billion in funding based on Census information spent annually in Colorado
- Breaks down to about \$1,481 per person
- School lunch programs, highway planning and construction, child care, and housing assistance programs

DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS CENSUS GRANT

\$12,864

Awarded to the city of Littleton

Covers costs for marketing and engagement
