How would the funds be used? *

To have a thriving community we must fully understand each other's unique differences and provide opportunities for inclusiveness. We have been welcomed and enjoy our interactions with the local community, but we know people still do not fully understand blindness and many do not even know why there are so many blind people in the area. With this funding, the Center would like to focus our educational efforts on those we interact with the most: local residents, city employees, and downtown Littleton merchants. The seminars will be fun, interactive and packed full of information on blindness, non-visual techniques and how and when to help. Each seminar would be tailored to the group attending. If it's the police department, we would talk about how blind people cross streets, interacting with a guide dog, and what to do if you need to arrest a blind person. If the seminar is for a human resources department, we would address how to help a person fill out paperwork, sign a document, and use of a cane inside a building. Neighbors typically have questions about needing to help a person walking in their neighborhood. We love and appreciate questions and have even given people canes or Braille books to better understand our techniques.

Our first step is education but we must take it further to make sure blind people have equal opportunities to live a full and independent life, and that includes jobs. Most people have no idea how a blind person would get to work, find a bathroom, take a message for a sighted coworker, and even how a blind person could pour their own coffee.

The next step will help to increase our community's economic stability. The Center will host resource/career seminars and networking events. We will invite local employers, various support agencies which provide services, community vendors and others to these dynamic seminars. Sessions will be available for presenters, vendors and blind individuals. Our goal is education that turns into actual job placement. With a 70% unemployment rate among the blind, every job opportunity is important. These resource fairs and career seminars will support older blind adults needing services and employment or volunteer opportunities, adults seeking jobs, and youth looking for work experiences and career assessments. Employers will find the seminars provide education but also the long term support of having an agency that can help with prospective employees, job accommodations, and equipment in addition to learning about non-visual techniques used by the blind, hiring, training, and even firing a blind individual.

The Center wishes to partner with our neighbors, government and employers to better serve all blind individuals and create a more welcoming, diverse and economically stable community. We would welcome the City of Littleton as a sponsor of these activities and would appreciate any assistance identifying interested groups and making connections within the city. We would eagerly promote the partnership between the Center and the City of Littleton.

The Crisis Center seeks continued support for our free and confidential services for adults and children impacted by domestic violence, including emergency shelter, therapy, community-based advocacy and legal advocacy. For the majority of our clients, the Crisis Center is their first point of supportive contact. We strive to empower them to assume control over their own lives and choose options that move them towards increased safety, well-being, economic productivity, and healthy relationships.

Funds from the City of Littleton will be used to support operations of our emergency shelter as well as our therapy, legal advocacy and community-based advocacy programs, all of which provide both in-person services and tele-services to best meet the needs of those we serve.

Our emergency shelter provides safety for those in imminent danger from their partner. We provide daily essentials, therapy, advocacy, safety planning, referrals to community resources and other vital resources to help enhance safety and well-being.

One of the greatest differences between the Crisis Center and similar agencies in Colorado is our therapy program. We understand the impact of domestic violence and the long-term negative effects it has on a victim's sense of safety and well-being. Helping a victim heal requires strong trauma informed interventions. The Crisis Center employs Master's level clinicians who provide free on-going therapeutic services to adults and children who have been impacted by domestic violence. Besides the standard talk therapy, the Crisis Center employs a wide array of innovative trauma-based modalities that aid in the overall healing of clients.

Our legal advocacy program provides domestic violence victims ongoing legal support and information, assistance with paperwork, and support at court appearances. Our legal advocates provide general information about legal processes, help victims file protection orders, child custody, assist with immigration issues, provide support at hearings, and offer attorney and other referrals as needed.

The Crisis Center's Community Advocacy Program (CAP) is an-evidenced based advocacy intervention that helps victims protect themselves and their children from further violence by utilizing the community resources that a victim reports needing. Community-based advocates assist victims in developing safety plans, provide case management, support and advocacy. Client outcomes realized by CAP include: maintaining a safe living environment, completion of the client's goals, decrease in physical violence and depression, easier access to community resources, greater independence and ultimately remaining violence free.

Other Funding Sources *

Despite early concerns related to funding during the COVID-19 pandemic, the Crisis Center closed our 2020 fiscal year with a positive financial outcome and look to end 2021 positively as well. While we continue to rely on government funding to support our direct service program staff, our focus remains on building relationships with our individual and corporate donors, collaborative partners and private foundations to increase unrestricted donations. Cultivation of individual donors over the past six years has yielded positive results in retention and additional dollars. Our virtual Gala event in 2020 exceeded budget and engaged approximately 100 guests virtually. We plan to host an in-person event in November 2021 with continued positive results.

We remain diligent in our mission with 79% of our funds going directly back to client programs and services. Below is a breakdown of 2020 Crisis Center funding, and we anticipate the 2021 breakdown to remain similar:

- Government grants: 65%
- Foundation grants: 6%
- Individual donors: 13%
- Special events: 7.5%
- United Way donations: 4%
- Corporate support: 2.5%
- Churches and civic organizations: 1%
- Earned income: 1%

Summary of how prior year's funds and/or in-kind services were used. *

The Crisis Center received \$2,500 in early 2021 for support of our direct service programs. In 2021 to date, we have served 275 unduplicated clients, specifically 19 from the City of Littleton. By programmatic breakdown to date, we have served: 34 adults and children in our emergency shelter, 102 clients in our therapy program, 189 clients in our legal advocacy program, and 65 clients in our community-based advocacy program.

Client surveys and assessments show overall satisfaction with services provided, professionalism of staff and volunteers, and impact of services received. Outcomes from both our emergency shelter and non-residential programs are positive, with an average overall satisfaction of 96.5%. Specifically, clients stated the following:

- 93% gained knowledge about community resources
- 96% know more ways to plan for their safety
- 100% are more hopeful about their future
- 93% are more self-sufficient than before engaging in services
- 98.5% understand the violence was not their fault
- 94.5% stated their overall emotional health and well-being have improved
- 100% stated their parenting skills have improved and they are able to connect with their children in a healthier way

As one of our clients recently stated: "No one really talks about or acknowledges domestic violence in upper socio-economic demographics, but the impact is just as real and, in some ways, even harder to overcome. The Crisis Center and its supporters helped me tremendously, but more importantly my son has improved as a result of the resources at the Crisis Center. It is one of the few places my challenges have been understood and supported because domestic violence usually only ends once someone dies."

Many times, when victims of domestic violence flee from their abusive households, they are unable to bring vital documents which are necessary for obtaining legal housing. These documents include birth certificates, social security cards, driver's licenses, etc. Recipients of Gateway's Housing Fund will receive assistance to obtain vital documents. Approximately 300 Littleton adults and dependent children seeking housing will receive support as they obtain vital documents which are estimated at \$35-\$40 per person. Additionally, Gateway's Housing Fund will cover housing-related fees and expenses per household which include, but are not limited to, housing application fees, housing deposits, and a small stipend for food and essentials. NLP's long-range outcomes are to instill a life-long love of learning, support children in performing at grade level and consistent school attendance, and help kids build long-term relationships with committed adult role models. In addition to serving the children, NLP has made a concerted effort to serve parents, deepening impact of work and creating sustainable support for students. The Rocky Mountain Stroke center is based in Littleton and has been serving the local community for nearly 25 years. We were founded in 1992 by a group of stroke families, physicians, and community volunteers in response to a gap in post-stroke recovery services. Currently, we are the only community 501(c)3 organization in the surrounding Littleton area and in the state of Colorado providing services to families and caregivers of survivors, low-cost and on-going stroke rehabilitation programs and a program for young stroke survivors (age 20-50s). Our mission is to provide information, rehabilitation and support to stroke survivors and their families in Colorado, as well as to provide education to the greater community about stroke. RMSC is where recovery continues after insurance coverage has run out. Our goal is to help survivors and families create new community and find a quality of life after stroke.

RMSC has established working relationships with several organizations in the Littleton area. These organizations include Littleton Adventist Hospital, Encompass Health Rehabilitation Hospital of Littleton, Littleton United Methodist Church, Douglas H. Buck Community Recreation Center, Signal Graphics, The Littleton Rotary Club and Bemis Public Library.

RMSC intends to use funding from this local partnership for the following programs:

Ongoing Family Caregiver Support Groups:

RMSC facilitates family caregiver support groups on a weekly basis, as social support is an important factor in reducing family caregiver depression and burnout. These groups are free to attend and take place on Tuesdays. The timing alternates between mornings and evenings to best accommodate family caregivers' schedules. We also offer breakout stroke support groups on Wednesdays and Thursdays where both stroke survivors and family caregivers can receive simultaneous support in a group format.

All of the family caregiver support groups are led by Licensed Clinical Social Workers and provide a space for those caring for a stroke survivor to receive support, caregiving strategies and information about local community resources. They also provide family caregivers with a sense of fellowship, comradery and community. Common discussion topics include Grief and Loss, Role Changes, Depression and Anxiety and Self-Care.

Family Caregiver Educational Series:

This three-part, virtual series will launch in November of 2021 in celebration of National Caregiver Awareness Month and will be free to attend. It will take place on the first three Fridays from 10:30am to 12:00pm. In addition, we have selected well-versed guest speakers to present on select topics throughout the series.

Overall, the series aims to provide a space for family caregivers to receive support, ask questions and learn about common caregiving-related topics and community resources. In addition, we hope to foster a sense of fellowship and community among participants, much like we do in our weekly support groups.

After stroke, grief can be associated with many familial losses. For this reason, the one part of this series will include a presentation on Grief and Loss and strategies for coping. Another part of the series will focus on post-stroke legalities such as living wills and power of attorney, Medicare and Medicaid and Social Security Disability Insurance. Lastly, a third part of the series will feature a panel discussion where family caregivers will share their perspectives and experiences in a facilitated format. This panel will be made up of a range of family members to include: spouses, adult children, siblings and parents of stroke survivors. The aim of panel will be to help family caregivers feel less isolated with their experiences and give them ideas of how to manage day-to-day caregiving challenges.

Funding will primarily be used to support RMSC staff Social Workers. Specifically, funding will be used for our Licensed Clinical Social Workers' time spent facilitating weekly family caregiver support groups, client follow up and the development and moderation of the Caregiver Educational Series. In addition, RMSC will be providing the Caregiver Educational Series' guest speakers with honorariums, using this funding source to do so.

Funds would be used towards general operating costs. As of Aug 10, season ticket sales are not where they should be as some patrons are worried about COVID. THAC pays every single artist associated with our productions regardless of audience size. THAC has chosen outstanding shows for the season that feature a limited number of actors and simple sets so as to be fiscally responsible.

Other Funding Sources*

In a normal year, THAC earns about 80% of revenue through ticket sales, compared with 52% for the theater industry. This statistic means that patrons value THAC, but if THAC cannot sell tickets due to concerns regarding COVID, we are at a huge financial disadvantage. The rest of our funding comes through grants from government, private foundations, and donors. THAC receives funding from SCFD, Colorado Creative Industries, City of Littleton, The Anschutz Foundation, The Nord Family Foundation, The Kenneth King Foundation, the Littleton Rotary Foundation, The Emily Frisby Endowment for the Arts, and from sponsors such as the Bank of Colorado, Perry Properties, Intracscope Accounting, and from private donors.
