CITY OF LITTLETON, COLORADO 1 2 3 **RESOLUTION No. 49** 4 5 Series, 2021 6 7 A RESOLUTION OF THE LITTLETON CITY COUNCIL SUPPORTING A YES VOTE ON BALLOT ISSUE 3A SEEKING VOTER APPROVAL OF 8 A 3/4 CENT SALES AND USE TAX INCREASE TO FUND THE COSTS OF 9 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS IN THE CITY 10 11 WHEREAS, in accordance with the Taxpayer's Bill of Rights, Article X, Section 12 20 of the Colorado Constitution ("TABOR") governmental entities are required to seek 13 14 voter approval for any new tax increase; and 15 16 WHEREAS, in accordance with the Colorado Fair Campaign Practices Act, 17 (C.R.S. § 1-45-117) the Littleton City Council may pass a resolution taking a position on any ballot issue; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, earlier this spring the City began a community research and engagement project to increase the level of voter understanding of the City's Capital 21 Projects Fund revenue crisis and provided information and sought opinions concerning 22 solutions; and 23 24 WHEREAS, polling suggested that many resident concerns related to the 25 conditions of streets and traffic; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the City of Littleton has a list of nearly \$100 million dollars in 28 unfunded capital and infrastructure projects over the next 15 years; and 29 30 31 WHEREAS, the City's Capital Projects Fund is currently expected to reach zero in the next couple of years without significant increases in revenue or drastic cuts in 32 33 spending and services; and 34 35 WHEREAS, the projected annual deficit of the Capital Projects Fund is \$6.5 million dollars each and every year; and 36 37 WHEREAS, the rising costs of repairs, replacement costs, and maintenance make 38 39 continuing to defer addressing these issues both unsafe and fiscally unwise; and 40 WHEREAS, almost 80% of the City's revenues come solely from sales tax; and 41 42 43 WHEREAS, the City of Littleton has not raised its sales tax rate in over 50 years and it is among the lowest in the Denver metro area; and 44 45 WHEREAS, a ³/₄ cent sales tax increase amounts to 75 cents on \$100.00 in eligible 46 47 purchases excluding those items already exempted by the Littleton City Code from sales tax such as groceries and medicine for home or personal consumption; and

WHEREAS, this sales tax increase would amount to approximately \$9,750,000 in additional annual revenue that would be directed to the City's Capital Projects Fund to be used to fund the cost of capital improvement projects such as major street maintenance and reconstruction in neighborhoods and significant corridors; Mineral & Santa Fe intersection improvements; downtown streetscape and parking improvements; public works facility replacement; maintenance and improvement to city-owned facility at the Littleton Museum, Bemis Library, the Municipal Courthouse, Littleton Police Department, and others; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LITTLETON, COLORADO, THAT THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LITTLETON HEREBY SUPPORTS A "YES" VOTE ON BALLOT ISSUE 3A AND URGES THE REGISTERED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF LITTLETON TO VOTE IN FAVOR OF THE PROPOSED 3/4 CENT SALES AND USE TAX INCREASE TO FUND THE CITY'S CAPITAL PROJECT FUND WHICH WILL BE USED TO PAY FOR THE COSTS OF DEFERRED AND BACKLOGED CAPITAL IMPROVMENTS PROJECTS THROUGHOUT THE CITY.
