Business/Residential:	Thursday	September 30, 2021	10:30 am - 4:30 pm
Residential:	Saturday	October 2, 2021	9:30 am - 4:30 pm

- <u>Survey Areas:</u> Circulators started in areas closest to the proposed licensed site and obtained samples throughout the boundary area. Please see attached map.
- <u>Circulators of the Survey:</u> There was one circulator for this survey. Prior to the start of the survey, the circulator was briefed on the type of liquor license application, the areas to be surveyed and reminded to remain unbiased in their approach to residents and businesspeople. The circulator had with them a face sheet with the applicant business name, location and hearing information, instructions, and the petition/survey issue along with signature sheets and a map of the proposed location. The circulator used tally sheets to record all contacts, attempts and reasons for opposition signatures and refusals. Upon conclusion of the survey, the circulator signed notarized affidavits of circulation. The original survey packets were pre-filed with the Douglas County City Clerk's Office.
