HPB Resolution 03-2019: Allocating 2019 Main Street Historic District Grant Funds

## **REQUESTED BOARD ACTION:**

Allocate funds from the Main Street Grant Program for 2019 first-round applications consistent with the criteria per section 4-6-12(E) of the city code and the 2018 Main Street Historic Preservation Grant Program.

Three applications were received for the first grant round:

- The Creamery, 2675 W. Alamo (HGRT19-0001)-request for \$25,530
- JD Hill General Store, 5728-32 S. Rapp Street (HGRT19-0002)-request for \$8,277.14
- Thomas Block, 2400 W. Main Street (HGRT19-0003)-request for \$36,155

## PRIOR ACTIONS OR DISCUSSIONS:

The Historical Preservation Board (HPB) has awarded funds from the Main Street Historic District Grant program per section 4-6-12(E) of the city code since 2006. The program received funding for \$50,000 for 2019. An additional \$2,410 is available this year from 2018 unused funds. This brings the total amount available in 2019 to \$52,410.

#### <u>Process</u>

For the 2019 program, HPB established two grant rounds as set forth below. The applications included in

## Review of second round applications

October 21, 2019

(approval, denial, or table to a date certain by planning commission at October 21, 2019 HPB meeting)

## **CRITERIA & STAFF ANALYSIS:**

The Main Street Historic District Grant Program is established per Section 4-6-12(E) of the city code. The HPB has established additional discretionary criteria, as permitted in Section 4-6-12(E) and as set forth in the 2019 Main Street Historic District Grant Program brochure. The staff analysis addresses all applicable criteria for each application.

## **OPTIONS/ALTERNATIVES:**

The Historical Preservation Board may take the following actions on the applications: approve, approve with conditions, continue to a date certain and deny. A sample motion is provided for each option along with suggested findings.

## STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Based on staff's analysis, all three grant applications for the Main Street Historic District grants: The Creamery, 2675 W. Alamo Ave., The JD Hill General Store, 5728-32 S. Rapp Street, and the Thomas Block, 2400 W. Main Street, are in compliance with the approval criteria in Littleton City Code section 4-6-12(E), as detailed in the staff report. Staff recommends approval of HPB Resolution 03-2019.

Note that the total amount of funds requested exceeds the amount available for 2019. The amount of funds awarded by HPB may not exceed \$52,410 in 2019.
